TECH TIPS

Before you take out your antique automobiles to the first shows of the season, you may want to pamper your baby with the finest washes and waxes. You might want to strip the old wax and remove a buildup that is not very noticeable to the eye, but is as you pass your hand over the surface.

One method is with the clay bar – this method cleans and removes all dirt, soot, and grime from the paint surface. This does take a lot of time and effort, but is the best way to clean the paint surface.

Another way is a non-abrasive detergent cleaner stripper. This is a chemical cleaner that has to be rinsed off quickly with water in a shaded cool place. Direct sun light can cause blemishes in the paint, but if properly used, this can be a quick step to get your antique automobile ready for the finest waxes.

The easiest way (but a bit costly) is taking your car to a professional shop. All you do is drop off your keys and pay the bill – they do everything else!



WHAT'S IN THE BOX?

A battery booster with an air compressor goes along for the trip. This is necessary for us as a club to better equip ourselves in cases of emergencies and never leave anyone stranded.
