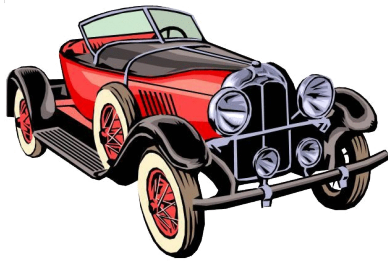

## ‘THE GAVEL’: A NOTE FROM PRESIDENT JACK TORRES

**T**HERE’S a buzz in the air and we’re proud to officially announce the details of our next club-sponsored event – something really special that no one has done before. We are hosting a TRIBUTE DRIVE-IN MOVIE at the Davis Farm in Wall Township. The date is set for Saturday, October 19 and all members, their guests, as well as the public are welcome. If your car has a working FM radio, you will be able to tune into the sound of the movie through your car speakers. An RF signal will be broadcasted at 96.9 FM frequency so that your car and outdoor speakers can broadcast the audio.

We have partnered with Robin of RoBeans, a local food vendor who will be selling everyone’s drive-in movie favorites like hot dogs, popcorn, movie candy, hot cocoa, coffee, cold refreshments, sandwiches, and more!

A \$5.00 admission fee per vehicle will be collected to offset the cost of the portable restrooms that are being brought onto the property. Anyone who donates four (4) cans of nonperishable cans in support of our 2019 Can-Can Drive will receive a voucher for a free popcorn.


The tribute to the drive-in movie will begin around 4:30pm. The movie will begin when it gets dark enough for the projectors to occupy the screen in full color.

Parking is going to be treated as first come, first serve, so be sure to come early to get a good spot! The picture and sound can be seen and heard from beyond 300 feet away, so every spot will be a good one. Larger vehicles are asked to park on either side of the fence or towards the back so that everyone can have the best view possible.

Volunteers are needed to help usher the crowd and more importantly to help with equipment setup and breakdown. A huge ‘thank you’ goes out to Pasquale and Vincent Del Ponte for allowing us to have this wonderful event on their property. We’d also like to thank Paul Dunlap for his audio and video expertise. His hard work and equipment truly allowed us to achieve this movie extravaganza.

I’m also especially thankful for the helping hands I received from Club Sponsor Jim Cattelona, member Ray Slocum, and Vice President Charlie Wines. Their help really made it possible for us to prep the stage to make this a reality.
